
Survey Results

The SC Statewide EV Survey was conducted by IVR and Online (Text-to-Web) Interviews from June 23 - June 27 among a random sample of 900 likely general election voters. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 3.3 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.

Q1 : Political Party

























How important would you say it is for South Carolina to promote the growth of its energy sources, such as solar and wind power versus importing fossil fuels?



Q14 : Candidate Clean Energy Support Impact


























What is your highest completed level of education? Sample Size: 900






